As a surface landowner of the above referenced permit currently being reviewed by the Alabama Surface Mining Commission on behalf of Cedar Lake Mining, Inc. and pursuant to 30 CFR 780.23(c) and 30 CFR 816.133 of the Federal Code of Regulations, surface landowner comments will be solicited regarding the reclamation plan to be implemented by the issuance and mining operations of the proposed surface coal mining permit. The current land use of your property is now "Undeveloped/No Current Use" as stipulated in Part II-J(1) and the postmining land use proposed in Part IV-A(1) will remain "Undeveloped/No Current Use".

The proposed reclamation plan will use Rye Grass and Browntop Millet as temporary vegetation species and will use, based on seasonal appropriateness, Common Bermuda Grass, Kobe Lespedeza, Fescue, Serala Serica, Crimson Clover and Yuche Arrow Leaf Clover as permanent vegetative cover.

Sedimentation basins will be constructed to control drainage and protect the existing streams flowing from the site and it may be necessary to leave some of these basins as permanent water impoundments. Permanent water impoundments can only be constructed at the site with the landowner and Alabama Surface Mining Commission approval. This will be done on a site by site basis.

For your convenience, we have enclosed a form letter and a self-addressed envelope, addressing these previously referenced items. You may use the form letter or compose your own but the permit process requires some type of written input from the surface owner of record.


